  - \* Accent on the strums (beats two and four)
    \*Alternating bass ~ bonus for root five

3/4 (waltz) time:

- \*Pluck Strum Strum pattern
  - \* Accent on the strums (beats two and three)
    - \* Alternating bass

### 2. Mandolin-style Ukulele Playing


4/4 or 2/4 time:

\*Rest on beats 1 and 3, staccato strum 2 and 4

\*Barre chord versions of open chords for affect


\*Mandolin "chop" is similar to uke "chuck"

### 3. Banjo-style Ukulele Playing

4/4 or 2/4 time:




\*Forward roll: eighth notes, PIM finger-style

\*Same pattern despite different chord shapes

\*Once mastered, feel free to embellish

3/4 (waltz) time:



\*Count "one and two and three and" per measure
\*Regular chord shapes, inversions as bonus
\*Listen to other players for timing cues
